Career and Technical Education in South Carolina

Secondary CTE is delivered through comprehensive high schools, career centers that provide supplemental programs to students in larger school districts, two correctional agencies, and independent, multidistrict centers that provide programs to students from districts without career centers. Postsecondary CTE is delivered through the technical colleges.¹



Career Cluster Enrollment (FY 2016)

Seven of the 16 career clusters in CTE lead to high-skill, high-wage, and high-demand STEM-related careers (Agriculture, Architecture, Health, Information Technology, Manufacturing, STEM, and Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics) and contain programs that prepare students for nontraditional careers.²
